

The huge economic loss caused by street and highway accidents is set forth in a preliminary report prepared by the Committee on Statistics appointed by Secretary Hoovar. On this subject the report saw in part:

"The recognic loss due to these approximately 700,000 accidents in which personal injuries occur can probably never be known. Several estimates have been made. The most conservative is based upon the usual liability of \$5,000 per life and average of \$175 for each personal injury.



Media treat crashes as isolated incidents, and not as a systemic issue.






Hawaii's roads are deadliest in the nation for senior pedestrians

HONOLULU (HawaiiNewsNow) - Hawaii roads are the riskiest in the nation to pedestrians 65 and over, a new report concludes.

The report released Tuesday from the National Complete Streets Coalition found that 42.2 percent of pedestrian deaths in Hawaii from 2005 to 2014 were seniors.

By comparison 15 percent of Hawaii's population is 65 or older.

Barriers and gaps and deficiencies that put intoxicated pedestrians at risk, also put vulnerable users with cognitive or mobility impairments at heightened risk too. If we really believe in equity, we should take them very seriously

Resolution Language

WHEREAS, the fundamental message of Vision Zero is that all traffic deaths are preventable and unacceptable; and

WHEREAS, Vision Zero was initially implemented in Sweden in the 1990s and subsequently the death rate for motorists in Sweden has been cut in half since 2000 and pedestrian fatalities have declined 50 percent since 2009; and

WHEREAS, numerous U.S. cities, including Los Angeles, California; New York City, New York; Seattle, Washington; San Francisco, California; Portland, Oregon; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; Boston, Massachusetts; Chicago, Illinois; Denver, Colorado; Fort Lauderdale, Florida; and Washington, D.C., have adopted Vision Zero policies that focus on safety as a primary objective in designing transportation projects;

And WHEREAS, by the enactment of Ordinance 12-15, which established the City and County of Honolulu's ("City") Complete Streets policy, the Council expressed its commitment to safe mobility for all roadway users;

and WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that no one should die or be seriously injured while traveling on the City's roadways; now, therefore,


For Vision Zero to be useful, everything has to be on the table, and for that to happen, everyone has to be at the table.


